February 15, 2019

Chair Sciuchetti began the meeting at 4:13 p.m.

Action taken: Motion to approve 2/8 minutes made by Gov. Clark. Seconded by Gov. Higginson. Motion passes. President-Elect Majumdar abstains.

Sanjay updated the BLC on the bar request bill (SB 5003).

• SB 5003 is in Senate Rules.

Sanjay updated the BLC on session progress.

- Sanjay provided update re: HB 1489/SB 5575.

 - It was suggested by Gov. Hunter that the bill is referred to Criminal Law and Solo and Small Practice sections. Sanjay will send bill referrals to those sections.
- Sanjay was asked about a section's potential position or testimony being brought before the BLC
 before approval. He gave examples of the types of controversial or politically-sensitive bills that
 would be brought to the BLC. Testimony provided by sections always includes disclaimer
 language that the testimony it is not representative of the WSBA as a whole or its Board of
 Governors.

Sanjay updated the BLC re: HB 1788.

The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) is working on a proposed substitute bill, which
would be a pared-down version of HB 1788. This substitute bill would likely pass out of the
House Civil Rights and Judiciary Committee by 2/22. Sanjay does not have the text of the bill,

but will pass it on to the BLC when he has it. A public hearing on the substitute bill is scheduled for Tuesday, 2/19.

 Court and potential conflicts or issues with the Bar Structure work group.
- Sanjay informed the committee that he would touch base with the AOC's lobbyist and pass along the details of that conversation and the full text of the bill when he had it to the committee.
