Meeting Minutes

April 7, 2023

The meeting was held via video conference.

Announcements/Updates

RPC 1.6 Reporting Data and Client Privacy

The subcommittee reported that it sent out the draft opinion to twenty-three stakeholders for comment with the goal of finalizing the draft opinion at the June meeting

Proposed Changes to RPC 1.8(e) and Comment Period Ending April 30, 2023

The CPE met with Anita Khandelwal of the King County Office of Public Defense to discuss suggested amendments to RPC 1.8(e). The CPE determined that no further action by the committee was warranted at this time.

RPC 1.4 and Language Access in the Client-Lawyer Relationship

The subcommittee circulated a clean draft and discussed language variations. The subcommittee will next send it out to stakeholders.

Clarifying RPC 1.7(a)(3) and Government Law Offices Representing Separate Agencies

The CPE reviewed a draft and will continue its review at the June meeting.

WA Attorney General Office Request for Advisory Opinion Re Reproductive Health Care

The subcommittee will develop a recommendation to the BOG for no advisory opinion but for a suggested comment, and to ask to place the issue on the BOG June meeting agenda. Pam will write to Terra regarding CPE action.
