The penalty for any infraction listed in this rule may not be 6 changed by local court rule. The court may impose on a defendant a lesser penalty in an individual case. Provided that, whenever the base penalty plus statutory assessments results in 7 a total payment that is not an even dollar amount, the base penalty is deemed to be amended to a higher amount which produces the next greatest even dollar total. 8 (b) Unscheduled Infractions. The penalty for any infraction not listed in this rule shall 9 be \$42, not including statutory assessments. A court may, by local court rule, provide for a different penalty. 10 (c) Infractions Not Covered. This schedule does not apply to penalties for parking, standing, stopping, or pedestrian infractions established by municipal or county statute. 11 Penalties for those infractions are established by statute or local court rule, but shall be consistent with the philosophy of these rules. 12 (d) Penalty Schedule.
