- The October 8, 2019 meeting minutes were approved
- Staff provided an update to the Board regarding the removal of an LPO seat on the Board of Governors.
- Renata updated the Board on recent and upcoming outreach events and information on new outreach
  materials for the LPO profession. Renata asked the Board for feedback to help in the process of making
  the materials.
- The Board reviewed questions regarding the Foreign Investment in Real Property Tax Act of 1980 (FIRPTA) decision. A question presented asked if an LPO provides a customer a FIRPTA form and doesn't complete it, is it still considered "selecting". The Board decided that handing a FIRPTA form to someone is considered "selecting". The Board tabled the remainder of the questions to be discussed at the next meeting on March 10, 2020.

  decision to support. The board advised staff to contact the LPO to come present to the Board at the July
  meeting.
- The Board went into executive session to review the winter 2020 examination. The Board approved the winter 2020 LPO examination.
