- Provided a summer grant to a local law student from Gonzaga Univ. who spent their summer working in an otherwise unpaid L&E position.

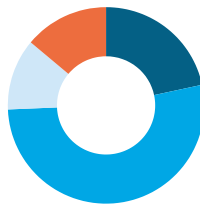
